Northeast Market

Located in the heart of East Baltimore since 1885, Northeast Market is a community asset and popular lunchtime destination. In 2013, Baltimore Public Markets partnered with community stakeholders and philanthropic partners to significantly renovate the Northeast Market exterior, provide new interior lighting and upgrade vendor stalls. The nearly \$2 million facelift has proven successfully with increased visitation and nearly 90% occupancy.



Broadway Market

Dating to 1786, today's Broadway Market consists of two separate shed buildings. Shuttered for over a decade, the north shed of Broadway Market reopened in 2019 as a newly renovated food hall concept with a wide array of offerings from traditional Polish cuisine to fresh seafood. The south shed is expected to reopen in summer 2019 as a 275-seat Maryland seafood restaurant operated by the Atlas Restaurant Group. The long-awaited redevelopment of Broadway Market has enlivened the Fells Point community and is attracting more visitors than ever before.



Cross Street Market

In 2015, Baltimore Public Markets joined with a private sector partner to undertake an \$8.4 million redevelopment of Cross Street Market. Cross Street Market will reopen in summer 2019 with more than 25 vendors – a mix of long-term vendors and new food concepts. With lively indoor and outdoor communal seating areas and a thoughtfully curated mix of vendors, Cross Street Market will be a regional destination and the centerpiece of the Federal Hill neighborhood carrying on the market tradition since 1846.



Hollins Market

Established in 1846, Hollins Market is the only public market to retain its historic Italianate brick head house. The market recently underwent a major renovation to turn the space into the social hub of the community. The market is an important asset to local residents as it is one of only a few places to access fresh healthy foods in the neighborhood. As such, revitalizing Hollins Market and expanding the fresh food options is one of the key priorities outlined in the Southwest Partnership Vision Plan adopted in 2015. Baltimore Public Markets continues to make the Hollins Market vision and redevelopment of surrounding properties a reality.
